Narratology and Drama

- "I needed to insist on the truly insurmountable opposition between dramatic representation and narrative."
 - Genette 1988 [1983], Narrative Discourse Revisited
- "It is therefore simply not necessary to turn to narratology when discussing drama texts. Indeed, applying narratology to drama dilutes the specificity of narratology and stretches its concepts to such a degree that they become meaningless; every character on stage becomes a narrator and a focalizer."
