Nor, as if taking the heart of roosters, establish amidst your fellow citizens a homegrown war and insolence against each other.

3. Scholia to Aes. *Eum.* 861-863

μάχιμον γὰρ τὸ ὄρνεον, τῶν τε ἄλλων ζώων τὸ συγγενὲς αἰδουμένων, μόνος οὐ φείδεται.

For this bird is quarrelsome, and alone of all the other animals, which respect their kin, it has no consideration for them

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
