

Conpaedagogita bene merens: epigraphic evidence on education in the paedagogium.

1. **CIL 6.8987.** *Alexander / Augg(ustorum) ser(vus) fecit, / se v̄ivo, Marco filio / dulcis(s)imo, Caputa/frice(n)si, qui deputa/batur inter v̄estito/res, qui vixit annis / XVIII, mensibu(s) VIII, / diebu(s) V. Peto a v̄obis / fratres boni per / unum deum ne quis / (h)un(c) tit̄u l̄u m̄ moles[tet] / pos(t) mort[em meam].*
Alexander, the slave of the two Augusti, made this, when he was still alive, for his sweetest son, a man of Caput Africae, who was classed among the dressers, who lived for 18 years, 9 months, 5 days. I ask of you, dear brothers, for the one God, lest someone disturbs this epitaph after my death.
2. **CIL 6.9760.** *D(is) M(anibus). / Carpioni / amico / b(ene) m(erenti) / fecit Helius, / conp(a)edagogita.*
To the Divine Shades. Helius, a fellow student at the *paedagogium*, made this for his well deserving friend Carpio.
3. **CIL 6.9761.** *Dis Man(ibus) / Neriti, / Pomponi / Materni / pueri con/p(a)edagogit(ae) / merenti.* To the Divine Shades of Neritus, the slave of Pomponius Maternus, a well deserving fellow student at the *paedagogium*.
4. **CIL 6.9763.** *D(is) M(anibus) / Onesimi / Oni, con/paedago/[gi] t̄ae bene / [me]ren[ti].*
To the Divine Shades of Onesimus Oni-----, a well deserving fellow student at the *paedagogium*.
5. **CIL 6.9762.** *D(is) M(anibus). / Noeto / Ti(berius) Claudius / Euangelus, / conp(a)edago ḡi/i(t)ae suo, f(ecit).*
To the Divine Shades. Tiberius Claudius Euangelus made this for Noetus, his fellow student at the *paedagogium*.
6. **CIL 6.9764.** *D(is) M(anibus). / C(aio) Valerio / Leonae et / Lyco, fortis/simis viris, / C(aius) Valerius / Myrismus / [-----], / conpaedago/gita(e) bene / merentib(us), / fec[erun]t.*

To the Divine Shades. Caius Valerius Myrismus and ----- made this for Caius Valerius Leona and (Caius Valerius) Lycus, the strongest men, well deserving fellow students at the *paedagogium*.

7. **CIL 6.9759.** *D(is) M(anibus). / Erasto / vix(it) ann(os) / XXII, con/p(a)edagog/i[t]ae b(ene) me(renti).*

To the Divine Shades. For Erastus, who lived for 22 years, a well deserving fellow student at the *paedagogium*.
