History: Launched in 1981 (offered 11 variants)—low numbers, through 1999

In 2000, only 5 variants were offered (Attic I Beginning, Attic I Advanced,

Attic II, Attic III, Homeric-Odyssey), no change in numbers

In 2001-2004, shift in names of the variants (Beginning, Intermediate,

Prose, Tragedy, Odyssey); numbers over 1000.

In 2005, the Introductory exam is offered with a steady increase toward

2000 exams offered.

Participation:

2009: 166 schools (1709 participants)

2010: 150 schools (1688 participants)

2011: 154 schools (1972 participants)

2012: 155 schools (1835 participants)

2013: 166 schools (1973 participants)

2014: 162 schools (2146 participants)

Interestingly, more exams are ordered (almost 150 more) but they are not returned

2011: 1964 exams ordered, 1792 returned

2012: 1919 ordered, 1835 returned

2013: 2214 ordered, 1973 returned

2014: 2383 ordered, 2146 returned

The goal is to award 50% of the participants awards. There is a scholarship that is renewable, which has been awarded each year.
