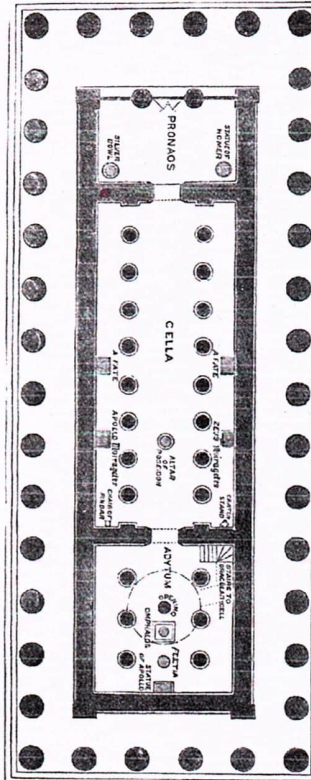
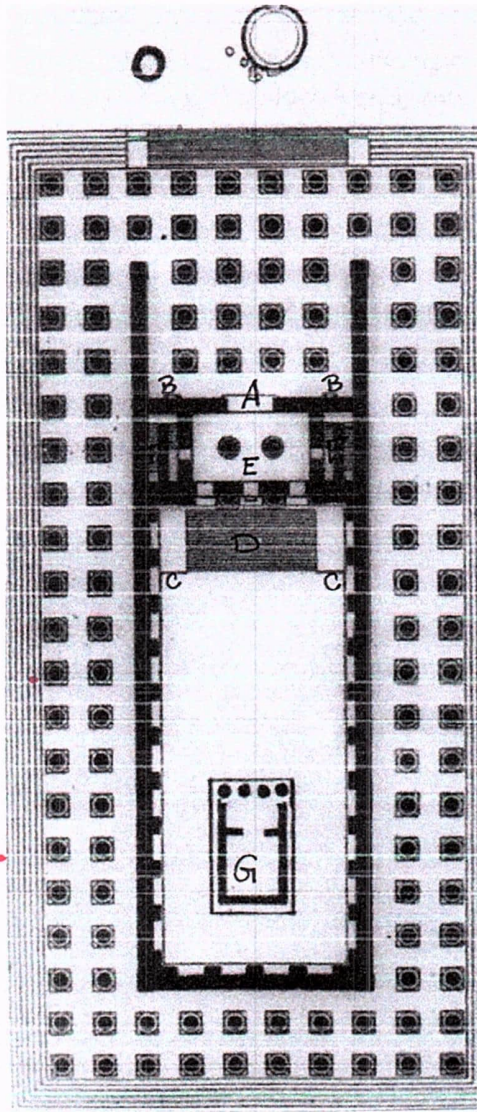
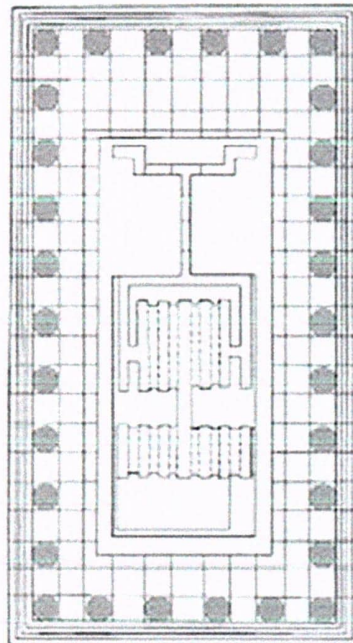


Figure 3: Temple of Apollo at Claros
