

The Poem as Offering in Gregory of Nazianzus' Poetry

1. Carm. II.1.34.77-8, 83

Μέλπω δ' ύψιμέδοντα Θεὸν μέγαν, ἡδὲ φαεινῆς
εἰς ἐν ἀγειρομένης λάμψιν ἐμῆς Τριάδος
... καὶ Χριστοῦ παθέων κλέος ἄφθιτον.

I sing the great God **who rules on high** and the splendor of my shining Trinity gathered into one . . . and the **undying glory** of Christ's sufferings.¹

2. 1 Samuel (1 Kings LXX) 15:22

εἰ θελητὸν τῷ Κυρίῳ ὄλοκαυτώματα καὶ θυσίας ὡς τὸ ἀκοῦσαι φωνῆς Κυρίου; ίδοὺ ἀκοή ὑπέρ θυσίαν ἀγαθὴν καὶ ἡ ἐπακρόασις ὑπὲρ στέαρ κριῶν.

Are burnt offerings and sacrifices as wanted to the Lord as hearkening to the voice of the Lord? Behold, hearing is better than sacrifice and listening than the fat of rams.²

3. Psalm 51:16-17 (50:18-19 LXX)

... ὅτι εἰ ἡθέλησας θυσίαν, ἔδωκα ἄν· ὄλοκαυτώματα οὐκ εὐδοκήσεις. θυσία τῷ θεῷ πνεῦμα συντετριμένον, καρδίαν συντετριμένην καὶ τεταπεινωμένην ὁ θεὸς οὐκ ἔξουθενώσει.

Because if you had wanted sacrifice, I would have given it; with whole burnt offerings you will not be pleased; sacrifice to God is a broken spirit; a broken and humbled heart God will not despise.³

4. Carm. II.1.1.414-17, 419

Λίσσομαι, εἴ ποτε δή σε πατήρ καὶ πότνια μήτηρ δάκρυσι καὶ στοναχῆσι καὶ εὐχωλῆσι ἔτισαν ἢ τινά τοι κτεάνων τυθὴν ἀπὸ μοῖραν ἔνειμαν ἢ θυσίαις καθαρῆσι καὶ εὐαγέεσσι γέρηραν, ... τῶν μνῆσαι . . .

I beseech you, if ever my father and reverend mother made repayment with tears and groans and prayers, or allotted to you something of their possessions from their small portion, or honored you with pure and undefiled sacrifices . . . remember them.

5. Carm. I.1.30.36-39, 42

Πάτερ, Ἄλεως γενοῦ μοι.
Διὰ παντὸς θεραπεύειν
Τὸ σέβασμα τοῦτο, δός μοι.
Τὰ δ' ἀμαρτήματα ρίψον
...
Ἴνα δοξάσω τὸ θεῖον.

Father, be propitious to me.
Grant that I may forever
Offer you this act of worship.
Cast away my sins
...
That I may praise the divine.
