Students Attend Latin Convention at Indiana University

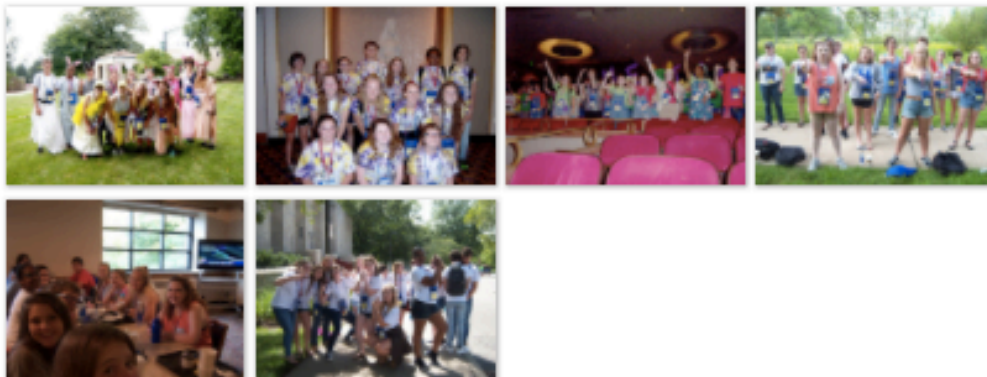
